



Within Persons Crimes, how do Violent Crimes compare to other Persons Crimes?





POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF VIOLENT CRIMES




Violent crime incidents were -11.2% below the 10-year average and decreased -27.6% over the past ten years

^{*}Violent crimes are defined as murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault

2022 DENSITY OF VIOLENT CRIMES




Of 331 Violent Crimes, 250 (76%) were Aggravated Assaults, and 54 (22%) of those involved domestic violence or child abuse/neglect.

High density areas include Norris Ridge, W Main St & John B White Sr Blvd intersection, Prince Hall, Spartanburg Opportunity Center, and downtown.



POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS*




Crimes against persons were -3.2% below the 10-year average and decreased -0.2% over the past ten years

^{*}Includes simple assault and intimidation, which are not part of the Index Crimes as defined by the FBI, but are included in monthly benchmarks



2022 DENSITY OF CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS




Of 1,210 Crimes Against Persons, 798 (66%) were Simple Assaults, and 371 (46%) of those involved domestic violence or child abuse/neglect.

High density areas include Norris Ridge, Prince Hall, Spartanburg Opportunity Center, W Main St & John B White Sr Blvd intersection, Victoria Gardens, and downtown.




POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY



Property crimes were -5.7% below the 10-year average and decreased -12.9% over the past ten years.



2022 DENSITY OF CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY




Of 2,363 Property Crimes, 627 (27%) were shoplifting and 490 (21%) were Theft from Vehicle.

High density areas include the Dorman Center off W O Ezell & E Blackstock Rd and the Walmart shopping center on E Main St.



POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF INDEX CRIMES*




Index Crimes were -6.4% below the 10-year average and decreased -15.0% over the past 10 years

*Index Crimes as defined by the FBI comprise murder and non-negligent manslaughter, robbery, forcible rape, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (including shoplifting), motor vehicle theft, and arson

2022 DENSITY OF INDEX CRIMES




Simple Assaults (798), Shoplifting (627), and Theft from Vehicle (490) account for 54% of our Index Crimes.


CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF ACCIDENT CALLS



Motor Vehicle Accidents were -2.3% below the 5-year average and decreased -10.7% over the past five years.



CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF PSYCHOLOGICAL CALLS




Psychological call types were +9.4% above the 5-year average and increased +22.7% over the past five years.

^{*}Psychological call types with "homeless" in the comments accounted for 0.07% of psychological calls for all 5 years.



CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF HOMELESS CALLS




Calls with "homeless" in the comments were +14.1% above the 5-year average and increased +99.1% over the past five years.

^{*}Calls with "homeless" in the comments and psychological call types accounted for 1.2% of homeless calls for all 5 years.









Of 78 firearm thefts from vehicle, 63 (81%) showed **no signs of force.**





^{*3.0%} of victims identified as Hispanic




2022 POLICE REPORTS – VICTIMS OF BENCHMARK CRIMES BY AGE



^{*23.9%} of victims had a known relationship with the suspect (31.1% of victims 17 and under and 19.6% of victims 60 and over)




2022 BENCHMARK OFFENSES CLEARED BY JUVENILE CUSTODY
